Feeding Instructions

One Feed Feeding Program

Feed this feed continuously to broiler chickens as the sole ration from day-old until market.

This feed requires no withdrawal prior to marketing.

Caution

This feed is not to be used as a treatment for outbreaks of coccidiosis. Exposure to one or more species of coccidiosis may overwhelm the drug in some flocks and prompt treatment will be required. If losses exceed 0.5% in any 2 day period, obtain an accurate diagnosis and follow the directions of your veterinarian or poultry pathologist.

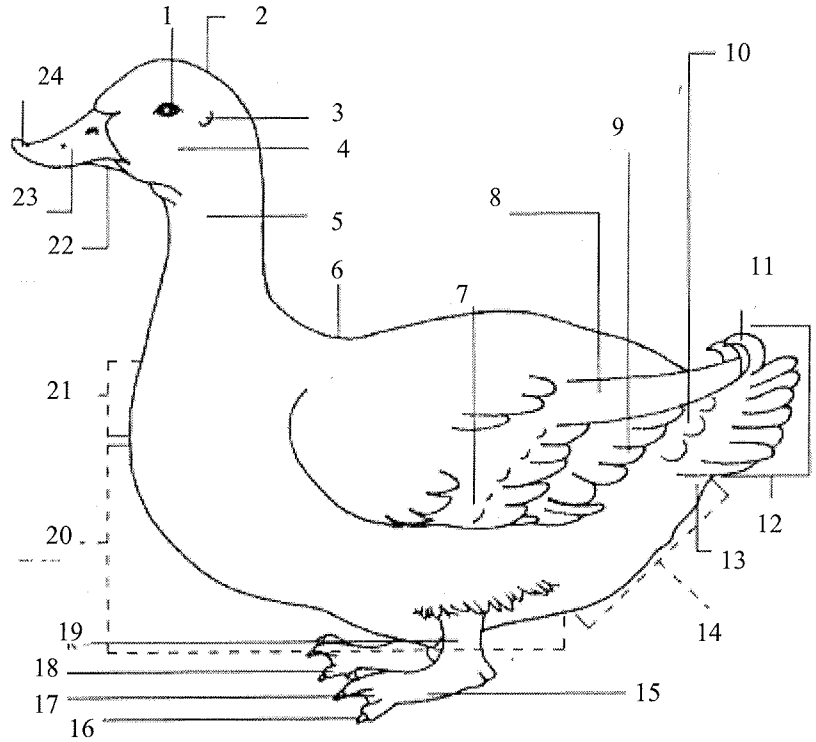

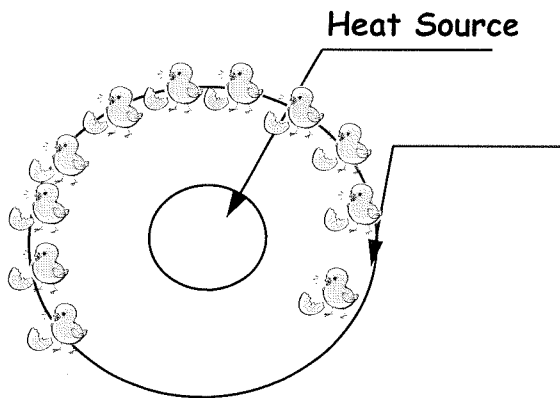
